(2) Hay Fever

From the start of spring to the start of summer, Japanese cedar and cypress trees

release a lot of pollen. This can cause hay fever, involving sneezing, a runny nose, and itchy eyes. Please take the following precautions to avoid problems with hay fever.

- <At home>
- OKeep doors and windows closed
- OClean daily

Carpets and tatami attract pollen more than floorboards, so it is important to keep them thoroughly clean

ODry laundry inside

It is best to dry your laundry inside. When drying laundry outside, it is important to shake off dry items before bringing them inside. Pollen levels are highest between around noon and 3pm, so hanging laundry to dry in the morning and then bringing it inside can also help.

- <When out and about>
- OAvoid going out when pollen levels are high

 You can check daily pollen levels on the weather forecast
- OPrevent pollen from attaching to your face and clothes

 Woolly or furry clothes, and clothes than can cause static attract pollen. Polyester and
 nylon clothes do not attract pollen easily. You can also try wearing a hat to prevent
 pollen from sticking to your hair, or using a mask to keep pollen away from your nose
 and mouth.
- OShake off pollen before entering your house
- OWash your hands and gargle when you get home
 Washing your hands to remove any pollen stuck to your hands
 and nails can help. Gargling can also help clear any pollen
 stuck in your throat and mouth.
