2. What to do in event of earthquake or typhoon Earthquake

1. Take precautions as soon as shaking starts.

If you are inside: shelter under a desk or other sturdy furniture.

If you are outside: get away from block walls or other structures that may collapse.

2. What to do after the shaking stops:


2 minutes after the onset of the earthquake: protect yourself!

- Open doors to create an escape route.
- Wear shoes to protect yourself from broken glass.
- 2 5 minutes after the onset of the earthquake: stay calm and check your surroundings!
- Turn off any stoves and gas outlets.
- 3. Move to an evacuation shelter if your home is dangerous. Your home could be dangerous when:
 - It seems like it could collapse.
 - There is a fire nearby.

Moving to your evacuation shelter.

- Turn on the television and radio to collect information.
- At the evacuation shelter, be ready to help others in need.





Typhoon

- Bring inside potted plants and other things that could blow away.
- Keep curtains closed as windows could break.
- Stay inside as much as possible.
